The COP26 climate conference in Glasgow have seen new pledges made by both governments and business that will contribute to our shared goal of curbing climate change and reach net-zero emissions by 2050. The private sector will play a crucial role in implementing the required changes, in close cooperation with governments. Nordic businesses are at the forefront of implementing change and driving new sustainable innovations. Working towards net zero in the business sector is crucial to meet the SDGs, and prevent severe environmental damage. This session will discuss the key areas Nordic companies can make a substantial contribution and what businesses around the globe can learn from their approach. How can we engage these actors even more in the fight for the climate, and what are their needs to achieve ambitious climate goals?

A key part of the "Nordic model" is close cooperation between the public and private sector. Public-private partnerships can help alleviate risk, contribute to shared knowledge and goal orientation for businesses working with new and emerging technologies and governments wanting to be at the forefront of the sustainability agenda. In the session we will highlight where these companies see public-private partnerships as key, and what is required to realize this potential.
